## Oak Wilt Identified in Bartlett

Oak wilt is a fungal disease of the conductive tissue of trees in the oak family. Symptoms can include leaf discoloration, non-seasonal leaf drop, and the eventual and inevitable death of infected trees.

Oak wilt was first identified in Wisconsin in 1944 and has now been identified in 21 eastern states. Oak wilt is most prevalent in trees that have been wounded by the construction of buildings and other development. This disease is spread by insects, rodents, pruning tool wounds and root grafts.

There are measures that can be taken to assure the health of uninfected trees. If a resident has oak trees on their private property, they should secure the services of a competent tree service featuring a certified arborist. The Village of Bartlett will respond to all incidents regarding trees on Village property.

## From the Archives



Fall signals the beginning of harvest season and, in the past, the arrival of the threshing crews to the Bartlett area.

Threshing is the process of separating the eatable and uneatable parts of grain. Decades ago this job was done by steam powered threshing machines and the men that operated them. This enamel coffee pot once belonged to Sophie Schick and was used to serve coffee to the threshing crews while they worked on the Schick farm. ## Free Fall Leaf Collection

For the health and safety of Bartlett residents, leaf burning has been banned in the Village since 1991. In order to help with the bounty of leaves each autumn, the Village's contract with Republic Services/Allied Waste provides for leaf collection at no additional cost to residents during October and November.

Leaves should be placed in brown paper yard bags at the curb each Tuesday, alongside other household refuse and recyclables.

DO NOT put leaves in plastic bags, as these will not be collected.

You do not need to buy Allied Waste yard waste bags for leaves.

Generic yard waste bags are accepted. However, all other yard waste, such as grass clippings, pulled weeds, etc., must still be placed in Allied Waste yard bags for collection.

Branches may be placed at the curb according to Public Work's brush collection guidelines for pickup through Nov. 15 for Area A and Nov. 22 for Area B.

Village ordinance prohibits any person from depositing, raking, shoveling, plowing, blowing or dumping any leaves, grass clippings, branches, snow, onto any public parkway, gutter or street. Excess leaves and lawn clippings can potentially obstruct sewers and large piles of leaves can freeze causing roadway hazards.

# Pride in Ownership

The Pride in Ownership program was started in Bartlett in 1996 to recognize owners who do an outstanding job in maintaining their property. The Village calls out for nominees at the beginning of the summer and volunteer judges visit all of the nominated properties, evaluating them on general appearance, landscaping, curb appeal and creativity.

So many Bartlett residents and business owners put a lot of time and care into their properties and it shows. This year's 1st place winner in the single family home category earned three nominations.

"I don't know the name of the owners, but they have the most beautiful flowers. Must see this yard," wrote one of the fans of this home on the nomination form.

The nomination form for the 3rd place single family home calls it "Very lovely and sublime!"

The owner of the 3rd place finisher in the multi-family category sent a letter along with her nomination form, which said in part, "For the last eight years I have taken the time each spring to clean up 'my space' by edging the area, tilling and amending the soil, planting a variety of annuals and perennials and spreading mulch. Finally during my eighth summer, I feel that I achieved exactly what I have been trying to accomplish...I am very proud of my hard work..."

We congratulate all of the nominated and winning homeowners and businesses and thank them for helping to keep Bartlett beautiful.

## Halloween Safety & Trick-or-Treat Hours

The Village of Bartlett and Bartlett Police Department have set Halloween trick-or-treat hours for 3 to 7 p.m. on Sunday, October 31. Please remember to turn on your porch light if you will be passing out Halloween candy.



Bartlett Police encourages parents to accompany children or have them go out with a large group of friends and to stay in their immediate neighborhoods. Children are also encouraged to carry glow sticks or flashlights when trick-or-treating during the evening hours and only go to homes where the porch light is on.

Trick-or-treaters should always walk on the sidewalk. If there are no sidewalks, walk on the left side of the road, facing traffic. Motorists are reminded to drive carefully and watch out for children crossing the roadways.

Costumes are a fun part of this holiday but only if worn safely. Costumes should be simple, flame resistant and, if possible, light-colored. Reflective tape can be added for extra visibility. Plan to use non-allergenic makeup instead of masks, and keep wigs and hats well off the face.

Finally, children are reminded to bring their Halloween candy home and to have a parent examine all treats before eating.

## Crime Prevention Month

In 1984, the National Crime Prevention Council (NCPCC) designated October Crime Prevention Month. Every year since then, NCPCC and America's beloved symbol of crime prevention, McGruff the Crime Dog®, have used this month to campaign for greater community safety and promote awareness of important issues, such

as cyberbullying, preventing senior fraud, identity theft, gang violence, hate crimes, home, neighborhood and workplace safety and more.

## Cell Phone Usage Prohibited in School Zones

Please remember that according to Illinois statute, as of January 1, 2010, cell phone use is prohibited in school zones while operating a motor vehicle on a roadway. Cell phone use is also prohibited while driving on a highway in a construction zone.

## Pedestrian & Bicyclist Safety

In July, Gov. Pat Quinn signed into law HB 43, effective immediately, which requires drivers to come to a complete stop for pedestrians in all crosswalks -- even those that do not have a stop sign or traffic light. Up until now, the law only required drivers to yield and stop "only when necessary."

The governor also signed Senate Bill 2951 establishing penalties for motorists driving recklessly and unnecessarily close to, toward or near a bicyclist.

These two new measures will save lives and help prevent thousands of serious injuries each year.

## Daylight Saving Time Ends

Daylight Saving Time officially ends on Sunday, November 7, at 2 a.m. Please remember to set your clocks back one hour. This is also a good opportunity to change the smoke alarm batteries inside your residence.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

---

## **Bartlett's water has levels of Combined Radium above drinking water standards.**

The Village of Bartlett water system has violated a drinking water standard. This is not an emergency, but as customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what the Village is doing to correct this situation. Bartlett routinely monitors for the presence of drinking water contaminants. The most recent test results show that the system exceeds the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for combined radium. The standard for combined radium is 5 pico curies per liter (pCi/L). The average level of combined radium for the 2nd quarter of 2010 is 8.0 pCi/L. It should be noted that this exceedance occurred at only one of Bartlett's five water stations, which are blended in the distribution system.

### **What should I do?**

You do not need to use an alternative (e.g. bottled) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

### **What does this mean?**

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, some people who drink water containing radium-226 or radium-228 in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

### **What is being done?**

This notice pertains to the 2nd quarter of 2010 (April 1 through June 30), when the radium removal system modification was still in progress. The well was taken offline for the entire duration of the repair. **The system modification was completed in July 2010, and the well was put back into service. Bartlett's 3rd quarter sample, collected in late July, indicates that no combined radium was detected.** For more information, please contact Tom Ruzicka at 630-837-0811 or by mail at 1150 Bittersweet Drive, Bartlett, IL 60103.
