### **Geneva & Westchester Men Charged with Resisting and Obstructing Bartlett Police**

On September 5, 2009, the Bartlett Police Department arrested Alfredo Chavez-Gutierrez, 25, of 707 E. State Street, Geneva. He was charged with two Class A Misdemeanor offenses for Obstructing a Peace Officer and Resisting a Peace Officer. On September 6, 2009, the Bartlett Police Department arrested Wesley J. Miletello, 32, of 1359 Portsmouth, Westchester. He was charged with three Class A Misdemeanor offenses for Battery, Resisting a Peace Officer, and Obstructing a Peace Officer.

On September 5, 2009 at approximately 3:00 am, the Bartlett Police Department investigated a suspicious situation where Chavez-Gutierrez was standing outside of a blacked out vehicle parked on the shoulder of westbound Stearns Road near Powis Road. Chavez-Gutierrez entered the vehicle while the female driver exited the vehicle to speak to the police officers on the scene. During the investigation, Chavez-Gutierrez exited the vehicle and allegedly obstructed the police investigation and was arrested. Chavez-Gutierrez then resisted the arrest and was taken into custody.

On September 6, 2009 at approximately 4:00 am, the Bartlett Police Department conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle on U.S. Route 20/Lake Street and IL Route 59. Police transported the front seat passenger, Miletello, to the police station after the vehicle was towed. Police alleged Miletello refused to exit the police vehicle and then resisted and obstructed Bartlett Police when they arrived at the police station.

Chavez-Gutierrez was released on bond after posting \$100.00. He was assigned a court date of September 29, 2009 at the DuPage County Judicial Center in Wheaton. Miletello was released on a recognizance bond with an assigned court date of October 21, 2009 at the DuPage County Judicial Center in Wheaton.
